a. 85 Central Ave (Early Bird Bakery & Café) – Nicole Kisel – Replacement Awning

Ms. Kisel was present at the meeting. She explained plans to replace the existing awning with a new awning with her business graphics on it.

Justification: The replacement awning fits with the aesthetic of the historic district.

b. 10 North Aurora (Whole Fitness & Wellness) – Kelly Williams – Signage
